Karen Grau is a 1980 graduate of Mishawaka High School and received her Bachelor of Arts Degree in Communications from Indiana University, Bloomington. After a decade of journalism and education policy experience, Karen founded Calamari Productions in 1998. At the time, Calamari was one of the first female-owned television production companies in the United States. As Calamari's Founder and Chief Executive, Karen brings 25 years of broadcast experience to all Calamari projects, from her time as a radio and TV news reporter in Indianapolis to the two decades she spent creating, writing and producing award -winning documentaries and TV series under the Calamari banner. Her career also includes three years as Deputy Legislative Director to former Indiana Governor Evan Bayh, where she assisted in writing three State of the State addresses.

Today, Calamari Productions remains the only production company in the world with special waivers granted by state Supreme Courts around the U.S. to bring documentary cameras inside juvenile courts and prisons, venues that are legally closed to the media and the public. Calamari has turned that trust and extraordinary camera access into award-winning films, series and video content used around the globe, from television networks and streamers such as ABC, NBC, MSNBC, Hulu, A&E, MTV, YouTube, Court TV, PBS, Bio and Channel 4 in the U.K., to universities and state governments around the country. Calamari Productions has won some of journalism's highest honors, including Emmy Awards, the prestigious Edward R. Murrow Award, and more than 16 national awards for its groundbreaking programming.







Joanne (Van De Loo) Van AverMaete 05-29-38 to 01-24-21 Class of 1956 Al Weis sent this to me after reading J.B. Rivards letter (February issue) on the NYC's 20th Century Limited non-stop passenger train from NYC to Chicago. Al said that the article brought back many memories for him and he wanted to share them with the alumni.

Trains

Our little house at 717 ½ E. 4th St. located between the Merrifield St. crossing and the Union St. crossing backed up to the New York Central RR right of way; we couldn't get any closer without being on the tracks. The trains both passenger and the Oh so frequent freights were a part of our lives. The freights went on forever and stretched to eternity. Sometimes my friends Jimmy Tinsley, Danny Raab and a few of the Boehnleins flock of 15 kids would count the number of cars, sometimes reaching as high as 130 in my memory.

Elkhart, IN was just a few miles east of Mishawaka and had a huge number of switching tracks for the freights to get all those cars to different locations. The bumping back and forth to pull a few boxcars off the main track was hard to ignore.

The switching process sometimes backed the cars up so the caboose ended up adjacent to our backyard. The caboose was a special car looking like a little house trailer with slanted roofs and a smokestack for the cook stoves inside. Some workers traveled with the freight to their final destination and cooked for the engineers. They would show us inside the caboose and if we were lucky, give us a piece of pie.

The 20th Century Limited, non-stop between NYC and Chicago, flew by our house at speeds up to 90 miles an hour, loudly blowing its whistle every afternoon heading for Chicago; it was a beautiful train. The front of the engine had a headlight centered in the middle of the tapered nose, which jutted out from the very front like a bullet. I believe it was called the Pacemaker, but we called it the bullet train.

The 1940s were the last days of the steam engine trains; they were the last beautiful engines. The giant main engine wheel connected with the long cam arm to the huge engine piston pumping in and out of the steam tank, hissing away, discharging excess steam. Puffing white smoke from their smokestack.

The diesels were nothing in comparison. Their whistle sound was not even as powerful. I'm not sure they even had cabooses. The drive mechanics were shielded by outer painted sides. You couldn't see the giant piston driving that huge wheel. Even the smoke from the little smokestack was dirty! The end of an era.
