Although MHS was once again accredited last year, the Committee for School Improvement has not stopped working. Since then the Committee has been working with the faculty and staff to implement recommendations from the AdvanceED External Review Team. The committee has also been working to develop a new plan that will guide improvement over the next four years.

Additionally, Committee for School Improvement member **Suzanne Dolebo** was asked to serve on a keynote

discussion panel at the Indiana AdvanceED conference September 13. The panel discussed issues teachers face in education today, as well as ways to make Indiana a national leader in education. A group of five teachers and administrators attended the state conference and gained valuable information that will help as the process restarts.

## Infinite Campus Portal Information

Parent/Guardians who want to setup an Infinite Campus Portal account to see their children's grades, assignments, and much more, may pick up their Activation code in the schools now!

- Go to the office of the school where your youngest child attends.
- Tell the office staff you are there to pick up your activation code.
- Be prepared to show a photo ID.
- Use the information on the sheet to setup your own account.

Benefits to having your own account:

- Once you setup the account, it is active until your last child graduates; no need to re-establish every year.
- You can make changes to e-mail, phone numbers, emergency contacts, etc. through the portal. You will continue to make address changes by contacting the school directly.
- You can view multiple students with one easy login.
- A convenient mobile app lets you keep up with student information.

If you have already created and are using your own portal account, there is no need for further action.



## Are You Ready to Compete to get into College?

The average student in this year's freshman class had SAT scores in the following ranges:

Standardized tests are the one measure schools have to compare students from different high schools. Good scores are essential to being accepted in this competitive environment.

Beyond the Cave is offering a five-week class for Mishawaka High School students to help you maximize your scores.

### **SAT Prep Course: English**

Review the fundamentals of vocabulary, critical reading, and sentence completion. Be prepared for the essay portion by reviewing how to effectively develop and express ideas, how to present those ideas logically, and how to use precise language to do so.

Note: Homework is essential and expected. Bring a dictionary to class. We will provide the textbook.

during testing include graphing and scientific calculators). We will provide the textbook.

## Welcome Back!

### Seniors:

College application season is in full swing. Please refer to the senior "to do" list distributed in your advisory class to get started on your next steps beyond MHS. A copy of this document was mailed to senior households and outlines important information for seniors to help them with the application process.

### What Is Parchment?

This is the secure electronic way that your high school transcript is delivered to a university or college. **You must** make a parchment account and request that your transcript be delivered to a specific school using this format. We cannot send your transcript via verbal request, e-mail request, or parent request; it must come through your parchment account. Universities expect to receive electronic transcripts not paper ones.

### Future Testing Dates at MHS

All sophomores and juniors will take the PSAT/NMSQT during the school day on Wednesday, October 19. This is an important test as it measures career and college readiness and exposes students to the SAT format. For juniors, this test is part of the National Merit Scholarship program. There is no test make-up day for this exam. Please make sure your student is in school and ready to test on this date. Practice booklets will be distributed in late September. Freshmen will have a regular school day. Seniors may use the morning for a legitimate pre-arranged job shadow or college visit. MHS study hall will be open for seniors who need to attend. Seniors received information on their options in advisory on 9/12/16.

## 21st Century Scholars

To better prepare Scholars for college and career success, Indiana established the Scholar Success Program, a set of 12 college-readiness activities (three per year in high school) that Scholars must complete before graduating high school.

### Completing the Scholar Success Program

1. Register for an online ScholarTrack Account at [www.Scholars.IN.gov/ScholarTrack](http://www.Scholars.IN.gov/ScholarTrack)
2. Complete the required Scholar Success Program activities to remain eligible to receive the scholarship.
3. Confirm completion of all 12 Scholar Success Program activities via student's ScholarTrack account before graduating from high school.

### Grade Required Activities

- 9 Create a graduation plan
  - Participate in an Extracurricular or service activity
  - Watch "Paying for College 101"
- 10 Take a Career Interests Assessment
  - Get Workplace Experience
  - Estimate Cost of College
- 11 Visit a College Campus
  - Take a College Entrance Exam (SAT/ACT)
  - Search For Scholarships
- 12 Submit College Application
  - Watch "College 101"
  - File Your FAFSA

In addition to completing the above activities, scholars must maintain a minimum of a 2.5 GPA and graduate with a CORE 40 diploma.

## MHS ATHLETICS

Going into sectionals with a losing record (10–16), the Cavemen Baseball team had the confidence that they had a good chance of winning the 2016 South Bend Sectionals. Their first matchup was against South Bend Clay who defeated the Cavemen earlier in the season by the score of 9–5. After seven innings, the game was tied 1–1. It wasn't until the ninth inning when the Colonials managed to break the tie when **Luke Campbell** walked the go ahead run in. Then in dramatic fashion in the bottom of the ninth with runners on first and second and one out, Luke Campbell hit a missile to the right center fence for a walk-off triple scoring **Dylan Hall** all the way from first. Not only did Luke drive in the winning run, he was the winning pitcher.

For the semi-final game of sectionals, the Cavemen took on LaPorte who defeated Riley in the first round. The Cavemen took advantage of some key hits and many base on balls to take a manageable lead of 10–3 before things started to get a little hairy going into the last inning. With the tying and go ahead runs in scoring position, senior **Sam Fry** managed to get his team out of trouble by getting the last out with a pop-up to first baseman **Bryson Stutesman**.

Next up was the sectional championship against Plymouth who ended the Cavemen's season last year. The team was looking for redemption and their first sectional title since 1997. **Sam Fry** who started on the mound pitched brilliantly by keeping the Pilgrims to one run. Then, the deciding blow to the Pilgrims was when **Ryan Wroblewski** hit a base clearing triple with two runners on base and scored on an error during the same play. The Cavemen were up 5–1 at that point and **Luke Campbell** came in to pitch the final three innings to close the door and to win the sectional title!

Next up was the Penn Kingsmen in the regionals that was played at LaPorte High School. The Cavemen managed to take a 3–1 lead but let it get away from them on some big hits by Penn. The Cavemen had a couple of opportunities to tie and win the game, but was unable to score. **Luke Campbell** pitched another great game before falling to the Kingsmen who went on to win the regional championship and then lose to a powerful Zionsville team in the semi-state.

The Cavemen finished the season with a 13–17 record that was lead by a great group of seniors of **Sammy Eggleston**,

**Sam Fry, Hunter Martsof, Zack Raes, Cameron Rice, Brandon Riffle, and Ashten Williams**. Next year's team is already looking forward to play for another sectional title in 2017.


