

WOW! What a year 2018 has been for us! Between all the doctor apts, surgeries, hospital stays, rehab, nurses and therapy appointments, we are still going strong and thankful for good insurance!

On February 5, 210 family and friends met at Arizona Community Church in Tempe, AZ, to honor Wes and Martha (Endicott) Pierce '56 at their 20/40/80 party. These numbers stand for 20 years in the Ministry of Senior Adults, their 40th Wedding Anniversary, and their 80th birthdays. Wes and Martha were picked up and brought to the church in a 1949 Packard Limo, including red carpet to walk on. (Wes used to own Pack-ards and belonged to the Packard Club). The morning included singing, trumpet solos, violin solo, and the audience shared stories about Wes and Martha. Lunch of Swedish meatballs was served, followed by cake and the singing of happy birthday and happy anniversary.

We did manage to lead a group of 24 from our church on an 8-day Alaskan Cruise in July. We had many, many people praying for us that we would make it okay. I'm still very involved with IN-Joy! Senior's at Ari-zona Community church in Tempe, although I'm not a Director this year. Wes and I were the Founding Directors 20 yrs ago, and it has continued to grow under the capable hands of several directors over the years. We were directors for 8 years.

Our family is doing great. The twins, our great granddaughters, Charley and Blakely, were here from Costa Mesa, Ca., with our granddaughter Lindsey and her husband Bryan for Thanksgiving. At 2 years old, they are very active. Our other granddaughter Michelle is involved in acting now and after being in several plays, is loving it! All of our children are doing well and seem to be healthy.

RETURN TO VIETNAM

After 52 years, I made a commitment to return to Vietnam. I booked through a national tour group that specializes in veterans wanting to return. Leaving Houston on EVA Airlines, we traveled for 16 hours to Taipei, Taiwan for a short-stop and then on to Hanoi. We were very surprised to see such a modern airport and also a brand new bridge over the huge Red River into downtown. On the way into town, we visited Hoa Lo Prison that many of our former POWs called the Hanoi Hilton. Although it had been cleaned up, it was still a drab and awful looking place. We stayed in Hanoi for two days and visited the HO Chi Minh Mausoleum where lines were three blocks long on a weekday. Much honor is given to him there on about 50 acres right in the city.

We then traveled by Vietnam Airlines to Ho Chi Minh City formerly known as Saigon. There are many sights to see there including the old Presidential Palace which is now called The Reunification Palace. There is still a huge presence of French architecture in both Hanoi and Saigon. Saigon is a very progressive, large city with an estimated 11 million inhabitants and probably 9 million motor bikes. We stayed in modern hotels that were clean and had wonderful western style breakfast. Our noon and evening meals were a Vietnamese five to seven course meals. One day, we had Elephant Ear Fish for lunch and while looking and sounding gross, it was really quite good.

We took one or two- day side trips to the northwest and northeast stopping each noon for a bowl of the Vietnamese Pho staple. While out of Saigon, we visited some war sites that others wanted to see. There was little to no evidence that Americans were ever there. Near an old airstrip, some vehicle trailers had extra sides made higher with PSP, an old military runway steel planking. We stayed in the Delta area where I was for a time in '68 and saw much change there. Between floating and city markets there were more than plenty of places to shop for what ever you liked. On our last day in country, our guide took us on a trip back to my old base camp area and the surrounding city of Bien Hoa for a re-visit. Everything had changed to say the least. Although, the air base, now a Vietnamese Army Base, and a few city landmarks were still there. On another trip, the Cu Chi Tunnel complex was an interesting place with much of the original tunnels still existing. We were guided through them for short distances to understand just how tight and small they really were.

All in all, it was great trip and I would recommend it to those who are thinking about it. The people were very friendly and have long since moved on from the war that I still had in my mind when I was thinking about going there.
