

We believe strongly in creating a positive school climate where students, parents/guardians, and all staff members work together collaboratively to maintain an orderly and safe learning environment focused on teaching and continued learning. Transpo MISHAWAKA STUDENTS RIDE TRANSPO

FREE WITH SCHOOL ID! Students who attend John Young Middle School and Mishawaka High School are able to ride Transpo school tripper buses as well as the Transpo fixed routes for

able to ride Transpo school tripper buses as well as the Transpo fixed routes for FREE on all operational days and times without limitations on weekends, evenings, and holidays by showing their valid student ID card.

STUDENT ID CARD

If a student has not yet received their student ID card, they will need to identify themselves as a John Young Middle School or Mishawaka High School student when boarding the bus to be allowed to ride at no charge. Once ID cards are issued, students will be required to show their ID card to be eligible for a free ride.

STUDENT BEHAVIOR

When students ride a Transpo bus, we expect them to have good behavior as well as show respect to the driver and Transpo property. The same consequences for poor behavior or damage to property apply as if they were on a School City of Mishawaka bus or at school. In addition, Transpo bans students from riding the bus if they fight, vape on the bus, or are abusive to the driver.



BEFORE/AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAMMING

SCHOOL TEXTBOOK FEES

Indiana House Bill 1216 requires each public school to provide curricular materials at no cost to each student enrolled in the public school. This bill took effect July 1, 2023 and established the curricular materials fund to provide state advancements for costs incurred by public schools in providing curricular materials to students at no cost.

This means you will not be charged for textbook fees this year. Please note that you may see textbook fees listed in your child's Skyward account. Those are needed in order for us to report the cost of the fees to the State.

FOOD SERVICE UPDATES

The Food Service Department is excited to welcome back all of our students! Below is the information you will need so your child(ren) is ready for breakfast and lunch on the first day of school.

MEAL COSTS

As part of the Hunger-Free Kids Act of 2010, School Food Authorities are required to review their paid lunch revenue annually to ensure compliance with the Paid Lunch Equity requirement. As part of the requirement, School Food Authorities are required to increase their paid lunch prices gradually until the school reaches the United States Department of Agriculture's (USDA) targeted rate. The USDA targeted rate for 2023-2024 is \$3.56. We received a waiver to help so we did not have to raise prices this year. The prices remain the same as the last school year.

- Parents should avoid contacting students during an emergency.
- Please do not rely on unofficial reports of information coming from word of mouth, social media and/or any source other than the official School City of Mishawaka communication.
- Parents will be notified by call and email as soon as possible.

REQUIRED & RECOMMENDED



The state of Indiana has released the immunization requirements for the 2023-2024 school year. Please make note of the updated requirements and recommendations. Indiana Code (IC 20-34-4-5) states that a child is not permitted to attend school beyond the first day without (A) a waiver issued by the school (not to exceed 20-days in length), (B) a valid medical exemption or religious objection, or (C) a written statement with the date/time of an immunization appointment signed by a physician or health department. As such, the noncompliant immunization exclusionary date for School City of Mishawaka is September 15, 2023. HepB: The minimum age for the 3rd dose of Hepatitis B is 24 weeks of age.

 $\mbox{DTaP:} 4$ doses of DTaP/DTP/DT are acceptable if 4^{th} dose was administered on or after child's 4^{th} birthday.

*For students in grades K-12, the final dose must be administered on or after the 4th birthday and be administered at least 6 months after the previous dose.

Varicella: Physician documentation of disease history, including month and year, is proof of immunity for children entering preschool through 12th grade. Parent report of disease history is not acceptable.

Tdap: There is no minimum interval from the last Td dose.


MCV4: Individuals who receive dose 1 on or after the 16th birthday only need 1 dose of MCV4.

Hepatitis A: The minimum interval between 1st and 2nd dose is 6 calendar months. 2 doses are required for all grades Pre-K through 12.

COVID-19: COVID-19 vaccine is recommended for all students five years of age and older per CDC and FDA's Emergency Use Authorization. *Review required after FDA full approval.*
